This course will provide you with the opportunity to learn on-the- job. Through your directed studies class you will be experiencing the real working environment of a film, commercial, video, webisode, web series, stage production, concert, event and television show. By the end of this class, you should be thoroughly familiar with the basic responsibilities, skills, tools and practices required of a crew member in your craft. You should be able to fill out reports, maintain inventories, track and fill out crew time cards, understand and practice proper set/stage etiquette and have a full understanding of how to navigate industry resources, unions, guilds, libraries, web sites and publications relevant to the industry and/or employment in the industry.

This Directed Study class allows a student to pursue directed study in film, television, stagecraft, and new media production crafts areas on a contract basis under the direction of a supervising instructor.
